

The Pennsylvania stone farmhouse had its beginnings in the 1700s, when a great wave of German immigrants arrived in Penn's colony. The new settlers cleared the fields for farms, harvesting the native stone for building homes in an adaptation of a German vernacular style.

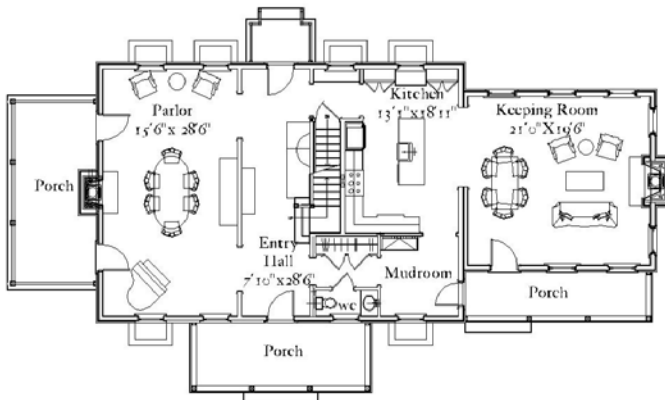

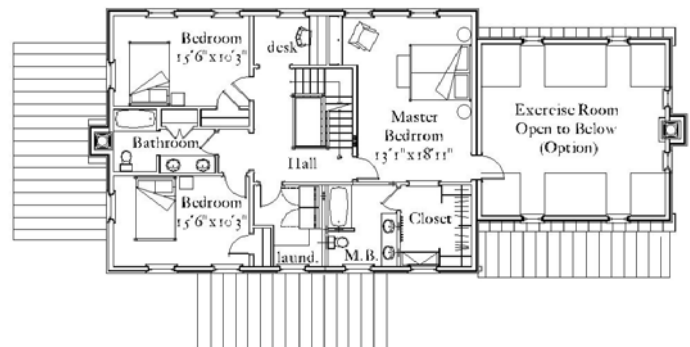
